

Fact Sheet- Medicaid

What is Medicaid? Medicaid provides health coverage to millions of Americans, including eligible low-income adults, children, pregnant women, elderly adults and people with disabilities. Medicaid is administered by states, according to federal requirements and is jointly funded by states and the federal government.

Who is eligible? Low-income citizens who meet certain criteria. States determine their own eligibility criteria within broad Federal guidelines. Youth who have aged out of foster care or are no longer in foster care are able to receive Medicaid until their 26thth birthday.
